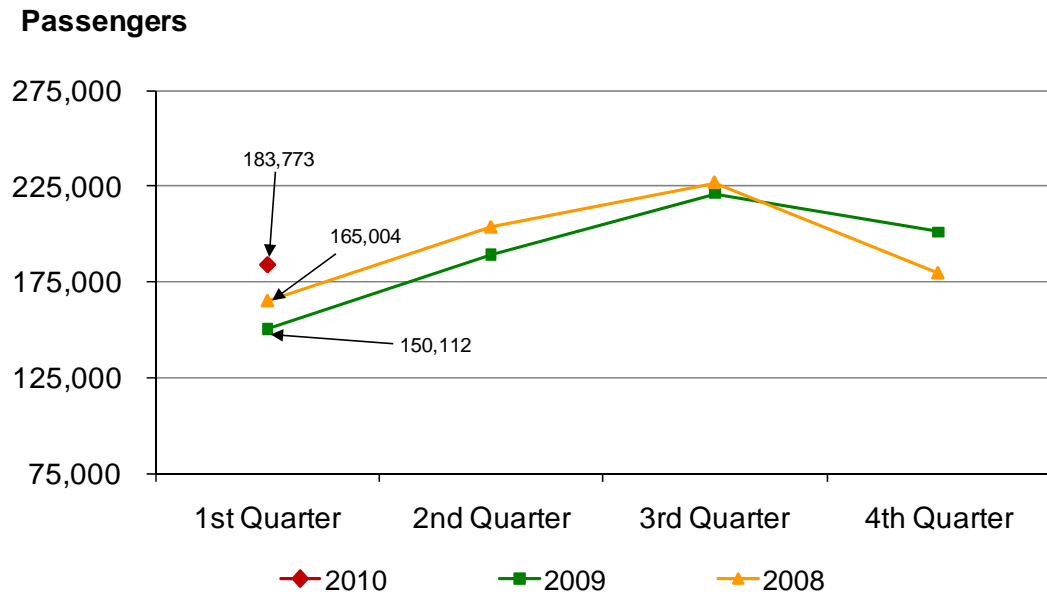


Amtrak Cascades Quarterly Ridership Report – January to March 2010

Ridership – Record 1st Quarter Ridership



- The first quarter of 2010 set a new ridership record with an increase of nearly 34,000 riders over 2009, making it the highest ridership for the first quarter since 1994.
- The Winter Olympics in February and the second train to Canada contributed to this record ridership.

1st Quarter Ridership per Funding Agency
