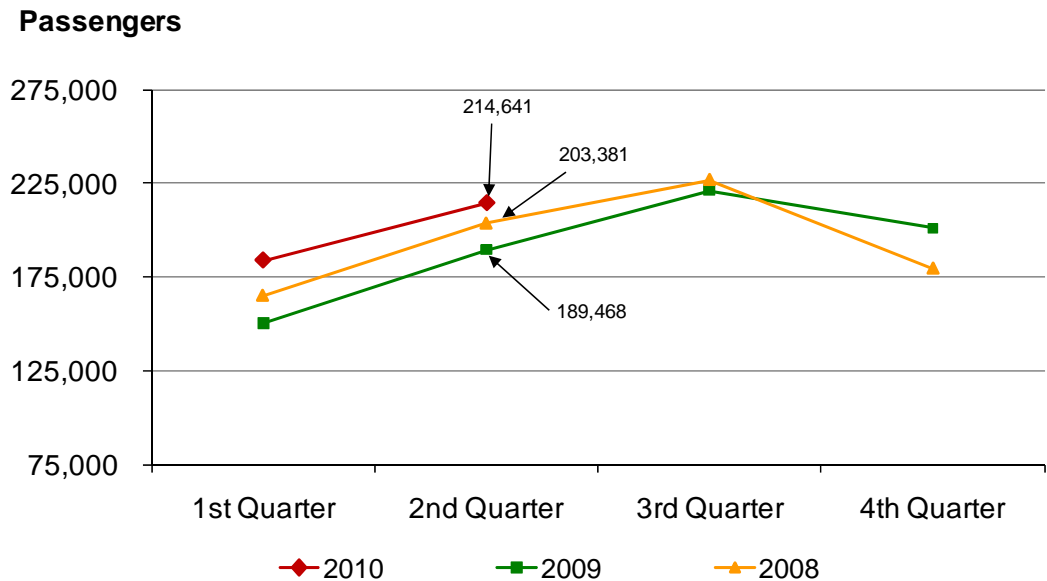


## Amtrak Cascades Quarterly Ridership Report – April to June 2010

### Ridership – Record 2nd Quarter Ridership



- The second quarter of 2010 set a new ridership record with an increase of nearly 25,490 riders over 2009, making it the highest ridership for the second quarter since 1994.

### 2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter Ridership per Funding Agency
