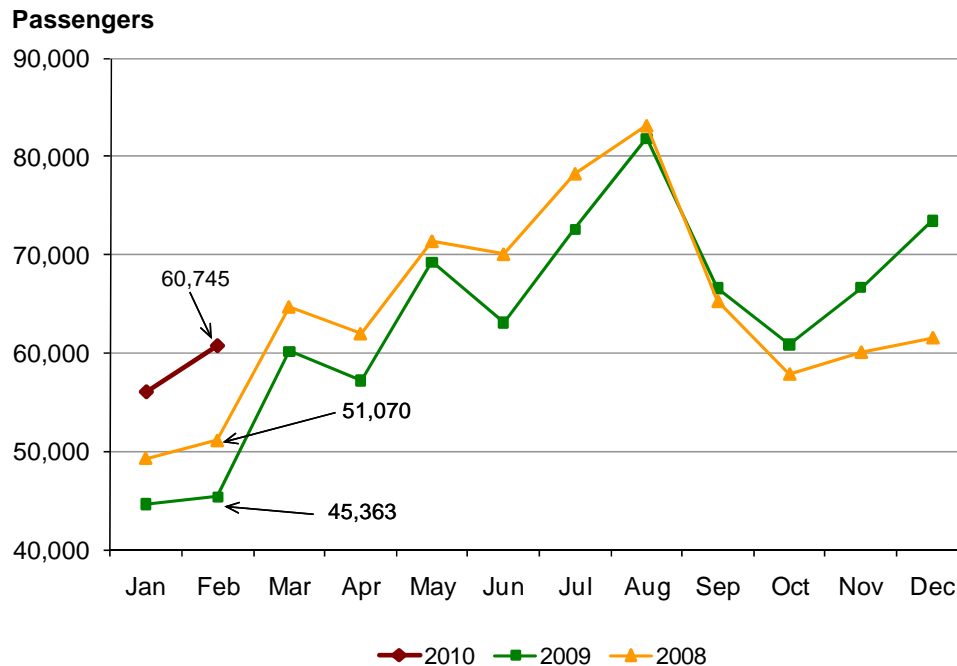


Amtrak Cascades Monthly Ridership Report – February 2010
